Chateau Haut Vignals

New owner Robert Baudouin is anxious to create wines that quite literally represent a return to the roots of fine quality Corbières winemaking. Taking full advantage of the estate's pristine vineyards, situated just outside the medieval fortress walls of Carcassonne, Baudouin has booked the trend of most other winemakers in the area by limiting the production of fruit opting to concentrate on sheer quality rather than quantity. While he has invested heavily in revamping the winery, his winemaking ethos is strictly traditional creating wines that are now attracting serious attention from many of the world's leading wine pundits.

Domaine de Matibat

Records show that since the Romans first trod the area winemaking has been inextricably linked to the proud history and culture of the people living in the Côtes de Malepère region. Fast forward to the end of last century this region was sadly often associated with the production of bulk wines of dubious character. Mercifully this has now changed, mainly through the vision of the Turetti family, owners of Domaine de Matibat. Independently minded Henri Turetti initiated a daring scheme to uproot much of the estate's tired vineyards in favour of healthier vigorous vines, many of which were new varieties to the area. His son Jean Claude now skilfully manages the estate with equal gusto and expertise producing a range of stunning wines from mainly Cabernet Sauvignon, Cinsault, Cot, Merlot, Syrah and in white Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc.

Château Laquirou

Roughly translated La Clape means 'pile of stones' and Château Laquirou is indeed a magnificent 'pile' when compared to most of the other winemaking estates in the region. This magnificent 38-

hectare estate, owned and operated by Erika and Eckard Hug-Harke, is widely considered to be the jewel in the formidable winemaking crown of the Coteaux du Languedoc. Its location, within the prime winemaking real estate of the Languedoc, is exceptional. Nestled within a protected south-facing basin which is ideal for producing fruit of extraordinary quality – a key ingredient in the creation of the estate's internationally acclaimed portfolio of wines. The surrounding area remains largely untouched by human hands and is also highly prized for its diversity and abundance of flora and fauna.

The results of his arranged viticultural marriages are proving to be a big hit with the likes of French wine bible Guide Hachette which recently conferred a highly coveted two star rating on this outstanding estate.

On current form this is an estate to watch as they continue to develop their winemaking endeavours by going completely organic.

Jean-Luc Baldès

Drawing from eight generations of family winemaking experience the wines made by Jean-Luc Baldès are grounded by tradition but are also inspired by his own modern winemaking techniques

and creative innovation. For example, Baldès recently successfully revived a style of Cahors wine known as Black Wine. Historically Black Wines were made by peasants who, unseen by vineyard owners, would pick grapes in the dead of night to make their own unique style of wine by heating the grapes before fermentation. Inspired by this style of winemaking, Baldès has copied this practice (albeit with his own fruit) to great effect. Fired by an unstinting determination to produce the very best wines Baldès are without doubt head and shoulders among his winemaking contemporaries when it comes to making top class Cahors.

Domaine Sarrabelle

Eighth generation winemaking brothers, Lawrence and Fabien Causse, are keen to express the unique qualities and flavours that can be found in wines made in the Côtes du Tarn – a region located deep in the south of the Vins de Pays. For owners Isabelle and Noel Rouballay its crucial that fine Touraine Sauvignon Blanc should represent the terroir and have a real sense of identity and place. Ideally situated on a plateau between the Loire and Cher Rivers, this family run operation is fixated on doing just that. Parsimonious use of herbicides and fungicides ensures that the local Touraine character of the wine is given an 'x factor' treatment and allowed to fully express itself and bask in its own ineffable quality. You be the judge! With a string of top quality vintages under its belt, there's never been a better time to treat yourself to top class wines like this from the Loire.

If you should ever find yourself touring the Loire Valley and need to while away a few hours in the village of Lodges you would do well to pay a visit to Eric and Pascal, owners of award-winning Domaine Pierre Marchand et Fils. They've recently taken over from father Peter and are


continuing the family tradition of producing outstanding, benchmark Pouilly Fume. Improbable as this may seem (touring the Loire, not Marchand producing Pouilly Fume excellence) we've always got a case or two on hand so you can sample what great Pouilly Fume winemaking is all about.

When compared to its counterparts Domaine de Villargeau is a relative newcomer. Established in 1991 by two winemaking brothers Jean-Fernand and François Thibault, the early history of this Domaine seems to be one punctuated by halfway houses. Their vineyards were originally classified as only vin délimité de qualité supérieure - somewhere in-between vin de pays and appellation contrôlée levels. Also, the estate follows a system of viticulture called 'lutte raisonnée', a system that approaches organic viticulture but allows for the reasoned application of some chemical sprays. But don't let these apparent ambivalences put you off. This Domaine has been going from strength to strength producing a string of medal-winning white and rosé wines that, at the price, are hard to beat.

Domaine de Gauletteries

Ideally placed on the banks of the Loire river, between Tours and Le Mans, this Domaine is fast gaining a reputation for producing some of France's best, steely dry Chenin Blanc from their Jasnières vineyard. With over a quarter of a century of winemaking excellence behind them, the good folk at Domaine de Gauletteries are currently running away with top honours at major domestic wine shows from Paris to Angers and London.

Domaine Philippe Raimbault

Owner and winemaker Philippe Raimbault finds himself in the charmed position of owning top class vineyards that straddle both banks of the Loire River in Pouilly-Fumé and Coteaux du Giennois. His outstanding Sancerres are made from exceptional hand-picked fruit, grown on soils that date back 130 million years to the Jurassic period, that are perfect for producing supreme Sauvignon Blanc. In recognition of this fact, Raimbault has named his best Sancerre Apud Sariatum, the original name of the village of Sury-en-Vaux where his vineyards are situated.

Domaine Bellier

Stretching across 24 communes covered by 400 hectares of vines, Cheverney was awarded VDQS status in 1973. Two decades later, based principally on the strength and quality of its wines, this appellation was awarded full AOC status in 1993. It's reputation as the latest top quality appellation has attracted a new, younger breed, of winemaker. Leading the charge towards winemaking excellence is frequent Guide Hachette Coup de Coeur winner Pascal Bellier. His 40-hectare estate, situated in Vineuil, is a highly successful example of a skilled combination of traditional and modern winemaking practice. Of particular interest is Bellier's Cour-Cheveney made from the exceedingly rare Romorantin variety which is rolled into an intensely minerally wine reminiscent of the very best Touraine Sauvignon Blanc or Chablis.

Domaine Nathalie et Gilles Fèvre (Chablis)

Husband and wife winemaking team Nathalie and Gilles Fèvre met at university while studying for an Oenology degree. They're both descendents of families that have been involved in making Chablis for generations. Nathalie and Gilles' passion for producing outstanding, authentic Chablis lead them to get seriously involved with the Chablis Defense Appellation Syndicate which rigorously opposes the extension of the borders of Chablis, fearing that this will eventually dilute the character and flavour of Chablis. The Fèvre's now own forty hectares of 1er and Grand Cru vineyards, which produce a quality, range of classy Chablis much admired by wine pundits across the world.

All wines are fermented entirely in stainless steel to capture the unique characteristics of great Chablis – crisp, well balanced and mineral rich.

Up until quite recently the Château were sole distributors of their wines, which are now exclusive to us in the UK.

This family-owned Domaine was built from scratch in 1980 by Jean-Michel Guillon who called upon the winemaking expertise of Rene Galland to help guide him through the process. Currently Jean-Michel has 12 hectares of vineyards spread across both Côtes de Nuits and de Beaune. The strength and character of his wines comes from a prolonged maceration and maturation in new French oak. These are without doubt formidable wines in the making, emanating from an estate to watch.

Since the late 1990's Chantel has been crafting extraordinary Burgundy, to much critical acclaim, using only the very best fruit from these premium vineyards. But it was not until descendent Roger Capitain took the winemaking helm that Domaine Capitain-Gagnerot really took off. Today, sons Patrice and Michel oversee the operation creating quite a reputation for producing an outstanding portfolio of wines from lesser-known Burgundian appellations.

Carel now oversees the estate's predominantly Grand Cru and 1er Cru rated vines in vineyards ranging from Puligny to Gevrey.

Domaine Chapuis (Aloxe-Corton)

One of the fascinating but often frustrating aspects about Burgundy is that unlike Bordeaux, an area of large estates often producing (usually) a single Grand Cru wine, Burgundy is a region of small Domaines spread over a number of different vineyards. This leads to a large variety of

individual vineyards, estates and winemaking styles crammed into a very small region. Domaine Chapuis is a classic example of this arrangement. Created in 1850 when vineyard worker Pierre Pavelot acquired a 1-hectare slice of vines in Aloxe Corton. Later sons Eugène and Maurice really put Domaine Chapuis on the winemaking map when they acquired vines from Emperor Charlemagne. Currently it's great grandson and perfectionist Maurice who oversees the operation. He has invested heavily in the installation of modern winemaking equipment and employs leading wine experts for that crucial second opinion on the Domaine's magnificent wines.

He severely restricts the use of chemicals and reduces yields to get a more focused expression of the local terroir in the resulting wines.

Domaine de la Pousse d'Or (Volnay)

Located in the commune of Volnay, between Pommard and Meursault, is the magnificent 'boutique' winery Domaine de la Pousse d'Or. Local historians believe that winemaking has been going on at this Domaine since the 4th century. However, Domaine de la Pousse d'Or's current lofty position is due mainly to the efforts of winemaker Gérard Potel who developed Clos des Caillerets, a masterpiece in Burgundian winemaking. In 1998 the unenviable task of continuing the tradition of winemaking excellence fell upon current winemaker and quality fanatic Patrick Landanger. The winery has not only increased in size and popularity but Landanger has also pioneered new techniques in winemaking. The estate's thirteen hectares of immaculate vineyards are spread among the communes of Volnay, Pommard and Santenay each of which produces Burgundy of the highest caliber.

owner is Jean-Pierre Cornut who, sensing that wine quality was getting a bit 'ify' during the 1990's, appointed Jean-Luc Parent in charge of the operation. Currently it's Jean-Pierre Jnr., who runs the Château, producing wines characterised by great depth of flavour with an overall quality that leaves little to be desired.

We've been following the phenomenal success of Raphael Sallet for many years and his wines have simply gone from strength to strength. Sallet is one of the maestros of fine white Burgundy winemaking and is internationally regarded for crafting exceptional Chardonnay and for developing outstanding wines from lesser-known village appellations such as Mâcon Uchizy. The key to his success is that Sallet leaves no rock, or vine, unturned when it comes to his fanatical attention to detail. He is a strict adherent of a viticultural practice known as 'lutte raisonnée'.

Roughly translated as 'the reasoned struggle' it attempts to avoid the use of chemically based herbicides and fungicides. While not quite organic, Raphael Sallet consistently produces wines that leave most other Burgundian winemakers green with envy.

When it comes to making top class Mâconnais no one does it better than Jean Thevenet. In a region where abundant use of chemical fertilisers are liberally used to increase yields that are mechanically harvested, Jean Thevenet's vineyards are anything but typical. Domaine de la Bongran is farmed organically where vines are kept deliberately low yielding. He also harvests his fruit much later than his neighbours, which gives his wines a depth, complexity and flavour not usually found in more run-of-the-mill examples of Mâcon wines.

Domaine de Roally (Mâcon)

It was winemaker Henri Goyard who initially tantalized the noses and tongues of passionate Burgundy enthusiasts with his rich and luscious wines from this estate in Mâcon. Widely regarded as a cut above the rest, Goyard stood down from winemaking after the 2000 vintage and his estate went to Gautier Thévenet, son of Jean from Domaine de la Bongran fame. Recognising that it's futile to attempt to guild the lily, Gautier has changed little possibly making a few vinicultural tweaks here and there. But the winemaking ethos remains the same. Massive attention to detail and vineyards run on strictly organic principles. Gautier, like his father, tends to bring in the fruit later than other winemakers in the neighborhood, which gives his wines a fullness and richness of flavour unrivalled by anything else in the region.

Domaine Chêne (Mâcon)

Burgundy enthusiasts take note. Deep in the heart of Mâcon, on the edge of Berzé, lies this magnificent estate which (since 1973) has been making significant winemaking contributions to their local co-operative. In 1999 family-owned Domaine Chêne decided to go it alone by installing a brand new winery to ferment the magnificent fruit that's hand selected from their 30 hectares of outstanding vineyards. We've unearthed real treasures here. Connoisseurs of fabulous white Burgundy should not miss the estate's stunningly unique Milly Lamartine – made from Chardonnay expertly hand selected from the estate's vineyards situated in this miniscule appellation.

Domaine de Rochebin, Domaine des Terres Gentilles (Mâcon)

Situated in a region packed with historical interest, this award-winning Domaine is perched on a hilltop overlooking the Saône Plain in Mâcon. Close by is the Paleolithic archaeological site Pech de l'Aze, which proves that agricultural activity has gone on in this region since the Iron Age. By comparison, at Domaine de Rochebin, winemaking has been taking place over a considerably shorter space of time but with equal cultural significance. Most of this Domaine's vineyards were originally cultivated by monks at the Medieval Christian Abbey at Cluny. Established in 1921 by

Jean-Pierre Marillier, this award-winning 36-hectare family-owned estate is now expertly run by son and rising star winemaker Mikaël Marillier who is now creating benchmark Mâcon-Village wines.

Domaine Jean-Claude Thevenet (Mâcon)

Fine Burgundian winemaking lies deep in Jean-Claudé Thevenet's blood. His grandfather before him was an outstanding winemaker working at Château de Pierreclos (also featured in this list) and his father developed an extremely successful business as supplier of top quality rootstocks to many of the region's major wine estates. Throughout the early 1950's Thevenet's father had the foresight to snap-up some top quality Mâcon real estate and used his quality rootstocks to populate his vineyards. When Jean-Claudé reached the ripe old age of seventeen he and his father bottled and released their first wine. Since then the estate has gone from strength to strength, it now exceeds 25-hectares of outstanding vineyards in the adjoining communes of Pierreclos, Prisse and Rilly Lamartine.

Domaine Didier Tripoz (Mâcon-Charnay)

When Didier and Catherine Tripoz took over a flagging winery in the early 1990's they worked assiduously to return this Domaine to former glories. The estate consists of ten hectares of prime land in Mâcon-Charnay planted with well-groomed Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. The Tripoz team was able to resuscitate some of the former estate's more vigorous vines, so now have a splendid mix of the old and new. Their wines are expertly crafted from hand picked fruit and regularly attract the attention of quality Burgundy enthusiasts.

Expect the unexpected at this Domaine – the realization of a four-year restoration project headed by winemakers Thierry Nouvel and Philippe Greffet. Wines from this estate are made from hand picked fruit, which, surprisingly, are matured in acacia wood, not oak. Roughly translated as 'source of the fairies' (or spring fairies to be exact). Perhaps it's the idyllic setting (just outside the village of Fuissé) and the immaculate vineyards crowned by a superb 16th Century mansion that are key to making wines from this estate truly magnificent. Or maybe it's the magic dust scattered liberally by Spring Fairies – we'll let you decide.

Current owners, the Pidault family, are responsible for maintaining the building and grounds and have also done much to install a state-of-the-art winery to make the estate's delicious white Burgundy.

Morgon is often regarded as the powerhouse of Beaujolais winemaking simply because there's so much of it compared to other regions. However, the very best Morgon is made in the Côte de Py where Gauthier has sizeable vineyards which boast immaculately kept old Gamay vines. Gauthier's viticulture is deeply rooted in tradition and he is staunch advocate of natural methods of winemaking such as fining with egg whites and using little to no filtration. His wines would grace any table or occasion.

His exacting winemaking practice dictates that he uses only the finest tools of the trade and employs rigorous fruit selection, which most other winemakers would find excessive. Charvet also has a healthy respect for Beaujolais winemaking tradition and he is proud of the fact that his vineyards consist of some of the finest old vines in the area. As Charvet says, *"To produce a great wine, nothing should be left to chance. Let's work with today's tools but whilst we should innovate, we must also respect tradition."*

Before Gremem took over in 1987, wines from this property would be shipped off to the local co-operative rather than be bottled under their own label. Without doubt this is an impressive Claret and proof positive that Bordeaux can match any other region in the world for winemaking quality, flavour and value.

This is one of the oldest and most renowned properties in Saint-Emilion. This stunning 55 acre Grand Cru Chateau was built in 1341 by order of King Edward I and played a crucial part in establishing Saint Emilion's international reputation for producing wines of the very highest quality. Owned today by the Chariol family who expertly craft outstanding Claret which in quality and flavour is more than a match for the estate's regal connections.

Château Haut Baradieu

This property came to our attention for producing extremely refined, classically styled St. Estèphe for a fraction of the price of those from loftier estates. As befitting a top quality wine from this region it is made predominantly from estate grown Cabernet Sauvignon, which gives the wine its structure and heft of flavour. This is a top fight Claret punching well above its weight.

Unwittingly, this modest estate (situated in St. Seurin-de-Cadourne) has a small but significant role in French history. Thereza Cabarrus played a prominent part in the Revolution by saving many lives. She was later to be a witness at the marriage of Napoleon and Josephine. The Cabarrus family has owned more 'illustrious' wine estates – Château Lagrange for one. But this is the only estate to ever bear the family name. Acquired by Emile Tereygeol, only three families have owned the estate in over two hundred years. Both Emile and son François have steadily increased vineyard holdings from six to thirty hectares. Today, son François and wife Odette run the property garnering a reputation for producing carefully made Claret with sound flavours and solid structure.

Viticulture at Château Saransot-Dupré is a strictly family affair. Winemaking in the Listrac by current owners the Raymond family goes back generations, to 1750 in fact, and it was not until

1850 that they settled at their current property. The dreaded phylloxera blight of the late 19th Century almost put an end to their dream. It was only through the courage and sheer dogged mindedness of the then owner Marie Raymond that ensured that the estate was not lost to the family. Today, Yves Raymond runs the operation, mercifully in happier times, producing elegant, award-winning wines of great class.

Fermented initially in a mix of stainless steel and concrete vats, the wines are matured in French oak for just under a year. This estate has steadily cultivated a reputation for producing “...*cru wines that they can be proud of.*” Guide Hachette.

When you learn that this estate has heavy weight Crus of the likes of Château Lascombe and Malescot as neighbours then you begin to realize the quality of the terroir at Château Deyrem Valentin. Owned by the Sorge family since 1928, currently it's Jean Sorge ably assisted by daughters Sylvie and Christelle who together continue to develop this outstanding Château.

Weighing-in at just under three hectares, Château Ratouin is, by comparison to others in the region, a tiny property located in the northwest part of Pomerol, near the town of René. Nomenclature has been a tricky business for this estate. Originally it was called L'Angelus but, after an owner of a property with the same name in Saint-Emilion protested, Serge Ratouin gave the Château his own name. Now, it seems, the property is due to change names again to Le Clos du Beau-Père. What's gone a little easier is the quality of this estate's wine, which the Guide Hachette describes as having an, “...*intense, deep colour and a concentrated, powerful bouquet with well-balanced aromas of stewed fruits, roasting, leather and high quality oak. The palate has silky, full bodied tannins and a rich, round structure.*”

Winemaker Robert Lignac owns just under six hectares of pristine Saint-Emilion Grand Cru vines. There is no actual Chateau, instead Lignac keeps a close eye on the wines he makes, and matures, in 5th Century cellars that are situated under his house on the rue Guadet. This arrangement seems to work. Lignac has a gift for consistently producing attractive, supple, award-winning Saint-Emilion that's perfect for early drinking.

Château Filhot

Without doubt Château Filhot is among the very finest estates in Sauternes. It's architecture, completed just after the French Revolution, is a neo-Louis XVI extravaganza that's equal to the majesty of the estate's wines. Made from a combination of rigorously hand selected Sémillon, Sauvignon Blanc and Muscadelle, misty conditions created by the proximity of the river Garonne create conditions ideal for the growth of Botrytis essential for the production of Sauternes.

Château Peymartin

This is the second wine of Château Gloria, which can be found in the central part of Haut-Médoc in the commune of Saint-Julien Beychevelle. This estate began shortly before the Second World War when Henri Martin sunk everything he had into buying the winery of St. Pierre. However, his finances did not stretch to him buying the brand, hence Château Gloria is not a classified growth. Instead Martin set out to improve the vineyard and create wines that would be judged solely on their own merits. Now assisted by son-in-law and keen winemaker Jean-Louis Triaud, the resulting wines, in terms of flavour and quality, are a generous expression of what great Saint Julien is. They combine true finesse with fullness and structure.

A delightful four-hectare property with vineyards situated on a slight incline in a southwest corner of Pomerol. On this particular hill Merlot is king and owners the Dubois-Lachaud family incorporate viticultural practices that have a real respect for the landscape and nature. The vineyards are traditionally ploughed and the fruit is all expertly hand selected. The resulting wine is well balanced with power and elegance in equal measure, gentle oaking has not masked the wines benchmark Pomerol character and quality.

This third generation, family-owned property can be found in the heart of Entre-deux-Mers in-between the communes of Castelviel and Gornac. It's here that current winemaker Jean Buffeteau carefully tends Sauvignon Blanc and Muscadelle vines in vineyards that benefit from an elevated position maximising sun exposure bringing the fruit to a glorious ripeness. The white wines of Château La Grande Metairie are classic expressions of their type. Packed with grapefruit and lychee flavours with distinctive orange blossom aromas.

Château Saint-Hilaire

During the 1980's Adrien Uijttewaal, a Dutch cattle farmer by decent, arrived in the Médoc and began working tirelessly to establish his own wine estate. He started by acquiring land on the banks of the Gironde river estuary in Jau Dignac Loirac, planting it with carefully selected vines. Gradually these vineyards were extended to the neighbouring village of Queyrac. Here he seized the opportunity to buy a 17th Century house (formally occupied by Dutch engineers) complete with a vineyard of well-tendered old vines. He later enhanced the property by renovating the cellar and creating more vineyard space by draining some of the surrounding marshland. Initially, most of the wines produced were sold to the local co-operative until 1994 when Uijttewaal decided to go it alone and bottle his own wines. Since then the estate's wines have been meeting success after success regularly winning gongs at top domestic wine shows including Gold medals at Paris, Aquitaine and Blaye.

Stand in the grounds of Château Lilian Ladouys and you'll be able to see, not only the estate's own magnificence, but also the vineyards of such illustrious estates as Cos d'Estournel and Château Lafite-Rothschild – giving you a good idea about the quality of the neighbourhood. Established in 1654 as the 'fiefdom' of Jacques de Bercoyan, Lord of Lafite, it was the Barre family in the 18th Century who gave the Château its reputation for producing some of the best wines in Saint Estèphe. However, from such auspicious beginnings disaster fell upon the Château during the World Wars when the estate's vineyards were carved up and mostly sold. Happily, today under the directorship of Pierre Fougere and winemaker Georges Pauli the Château has returned to former glories.

Château de Respide

Built during the 17th Century, Château de Respide is one of the oldest wine estates in Graves and was established by Monsieur de la Reynie, lieutenant to King Louis XVI. This handsome Château is set in a remote wooded park just outside the village of Roaillan. The estate's thirty hectares of vineyards are ideally situated on the banks of the river Garonne. Throughout its history this estate has been synonymous with the production of outstanding red and white wines.

Château Labadie

Since the aftermath of the French Revolution the Dupuy family through successive purchases of small vineyards, have finally in 1970, created Château Labadie. Currently son Joel makes the wines and oversees an ongoing programme to improve the winery and vineyards. He's also invested in a new barrel cellar in which he skillfully matures the estate's magnificent wines.

Situated on a hillock overlooking Pessac-Léognan, Château Mirebeau has ten acres of vineyards, which, from a winemaker's point of view, are inimitably blessed with soils that are a mix of gravel, clay, sand, chalk and the odd sea fossil. In the hands of a great winemaker, such as Mirebeau's Cyril Dubrey, this rare soil composition comes through in the complexity of the eventual wines, giving them a uniqueness of place and identity.

Château Larrivet-Haut-Brion

French wine history buffs will no doubt be interested to know that Château Larrivet-Haut-Brion was originally a much larger operation and, at the time of the French Revolution, was called Château de Canolle. After frequent changes of name, not forgetting a memorable challenge in 1936 by the American owners of Château Haut-Brion, the current nomenclature was established. It was then owned by Madame Guillemaud, assisted by grandson Francis Boutenay, who together made vast winemaking improvements. However, in 1988 it was sold to the Gerverson family, owners of Bon Maman a well-known brand of preserves. Mercifully, the company had the foresight to keep Boutenay on as winemaker, so the current batch of wines are anything but jammy. The style of red wines are quintessentially Graves with pronounced tobacco aromas, vivid red fruit flavours and marked character.

The Meffres, well known Rhône winemakers, retrieved Château Bellegrave from San Francisco based négociant M. van der Voort in 1997. They purchased just under three hectares of vines which are widely considered to be from the oldest vineyards in Pauillac. Les Sieurs de Bellegrave is the second wine of this estate exhibiting benchmark violet and blackberry aromas and flavours.

They then set about getting the very best out of their new acquisition. The vineyards are situated on steep terraces which, while overlooking Libourne, enjoy maximum exposure to the sun. This helps create award-winning wines that are expressive of the terroir and packed with red berry, pepper and vanilla aromas and flavours.

In 2001 ex-pat Canadian Philip Holzberg left his native Vancouver on a quest to successfully own and operate a Château in Bordeaux. He bought Château Franc Cardinal which is located in one of Bordeaux's smallest appellations, Côtes de Francs - blink while driving and you'll miss it. The estate's vines are in an idyllic pastoral setting - gently rolling hills, cow pastures, hay fields and woods. Holzberg specializes in producing Merlot dominated wines with a splash of Cabernet Franc and Malbec that are much admired by the locals including previous owner and winemaker Jean-Louis Lacour.

With a string of top Aussie wine awards to their name (including a Gold at the illustrious Perth Wine Show) simply put, this is modern Langhorne Creek winemaking at its finest.

Moncellier

Like so many of life's wonderful achievements, Moncellier wines was conceived during a couple of beers and roughed-out on the back of a beer mat. But don't let this outstanding estate's humble beginnings fool you – Moncellier has some of the country's best winemaking brains and viticultural know-how behind it. For example, Director Bill Spence has forgotten more about New Zealand winemaking than most of his counterparts know. Along with brother Ross he was the first to plant Sauvignon Blanc – the variety, which arguably, has done more to put New Zealand on the international

winemaking stage than any other. He was the inaugural Chairman of the highly influential New Zealand Wine Guild and has served as General Manager at Beringer Blass (NZ) and Matua Valley Wines. It was while at Matua when he first met Science under graduate (and eventual Moncellier winemaker/partner) Greg Rowdon. “He was a bit soft to start with”, said Spence “but eventually he came right.” Rowdon spent the next five years at Matua learning winemaking, under the close guidance of Spence, before eventually leaving to craft the outstanding wine portfolio currently available from Moncellier.

Quinta das Herédias

This Quinta is quickly developing a worldwide reputation for creating sumptuously styled Port of the highest order. In 1996 Madame Mondant established herself in the area by first acquiring the ancient Quinto do Convento monastery. By the end of last century she had also added three other Quintas to her portfolio, including Quinta das Herédias. The winemaking is overseen by Jean Hugues Gros who trained with Jacques Prieur in Burgundy. He uses only hand selected, estate




grown fruit, much of which is selected from vines that exceed sixty years of age. Recently, Ports from Quinta das Herédias have been attracting serious attention from some of the world's best wine critics including Robert Parker who had this to say about the Quinta's Ruby Port. *"It is a stunning offering that is in complete contrast with the industrial ruby ports produced by the big Port houses... This producer was a real discovery for me, especially their 10 to 20 year old Tawny ports."*

Tenuta Girolamo

Look closely on a fairly detailed map of Italy, and in the ‘heel of the boot’ of Italy you’ll find Puglia in a geographical area called Carsica. Look closer still, you’ll find the Itria Valley where Tenuta Girolamo is located. And if you could focus in further, in a Google Earth style, you’ll notice that the soil in this area is coloured an attractive red. Locally called Bolo, this soil type is key to the unique character of top class Puglian wines. Tenuta Girolamo was created in 2000 when Signore Michele inherited three hectares of vines and decided to make wine for friends and family. The reaction was so great that he was inspired to purchase more vineyards and within four years the estate has grown in size to over fifty hectares. Currently, it’s Stefano Chioccioli who’s at the winemaking helm, crafting a stunning range of wines principally from Primitivo, Merlot and Chardonnay.

Tenuta Lenzini

The cultural pedigree and heritage of this estate could not be finer. Lovers of the work of Dutch painter Jan Van Eyck may well be familiar with his painting “The Arnolfini Marriage” completed in 1434. Well, the Arnolfini family built an outstanding estate, known for the quality of its terroir, called Vigna di Gregano. In the 1900’s the Marchi family bought the estate to continue the production of fine olive oil and wine. In 1996, locally born and bred Franco Lenzini, purchased the property and realized a lifetime’s ambition of owning a wine estate of the highest order. Currently the property is known as Tenuta Lenzini and is expertly run by Benedetta, granddaughter of Franco Lenzini, and her husband Michele. Currently the estate owns twenty-four acres of vines which are planted with Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah, Alicante, Vermentino and Sauvignon Blanc. Not forgetting six hectares planted with the best Leccino and Frantolo olive trees. Ippolito

Unusually, this estate shares common ground between itself and Cirò wines. Established in 1845, Ippolito is the oldest vineyard in Calabria. Likewise Cirò is believed to be one of the oldest wine styles. Made with a vine variety called Gaglioppo, this style of wine extends back to pre-Roman times when this part of Italy was known as Magna Graecia (Greater Greece). History lesson over, Ippolito, owned by Giuseppe Ippolito, is situated on hills overlooking the Ionian Sea. Here, Giuseppe makes one of the best examples of Cirò to be found anywhere, which is aged in oak to enhance its moreish, dark cherry flavours.

Terre di Leone

Located in Verona, just outside the village of Marano di Valpolicella, this estate is a relative newcomer to Italian winemaking excellence. Terre di Leone specialise in growing indigenous grape varieties and re-interpreting them into modern style wines. They also create outstanding Amarone wines. At a recent wine tasting hosted by Jancis Robinson Terre di Leone Amarone della Valpolicella was described as, *"Intense and fresh, ripe sour cherry. Then delightfully rich, sweet and smooth on the palate. Dense tannins enveloped by sweet fruit. Delicious. Full of life and long."*
